Community Partners, attached is the Central Patrol Division daily Crime Report for 03-29-10.

Also attached is information on Methamphetamine(meth) and some signs of a meth lab. If suspected do not confront the neighbor/business or those suspected and contact the police immediately.

What is Methamphetamine

Methamphetamines are synthetic amphetamines or stimulants.

Methamphetamine (Meth) stimulates the central nervous system and the effects can last anywhere

from 8-24 hours. It is extremely addictive and produces a severe craving for the drug.

Clandestine Drug Labs

Due to the multiple chemicals used to make the drug, Meth labs are extremely volatile while in the “cook” phase. Meth labs can be found in a variety of locations including suburban and rural residences, barns, outbuildings hotels, motels, apartments, storage facilities, vacant or abandoned buildings, and in some cases vehicles. Meth labs are hazardous to the public due to their volatile state and the toxins created while making the drug. Meth labs are also costly to the public in the removal of the toxic contaminants.

Items to Watch For in Clandestine Labs

Large rolls of aluminum foil.

Many packages of coffee filters or other filters.



Quantities of chemicals.

Large Amounts of Ephedrine or pseudo-ephedrine.

Scientific glassware, boxes of plastic or glass tubing.

Beakers, funnels, condenser tubes.

Cooking devices, mantels, hot plates, camping stove.

Suspicious odors.

An unusual amount of activity around sheds, cabins, or out buildings
