

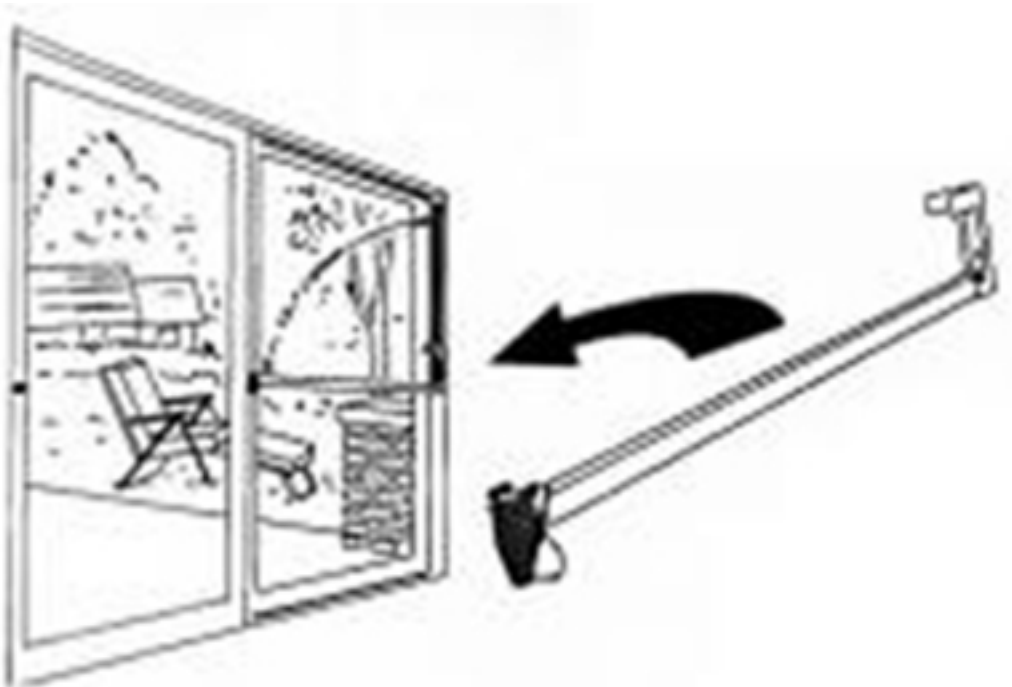

Burglary Prevention Tip

Sliding patio doors

Patio doors can be

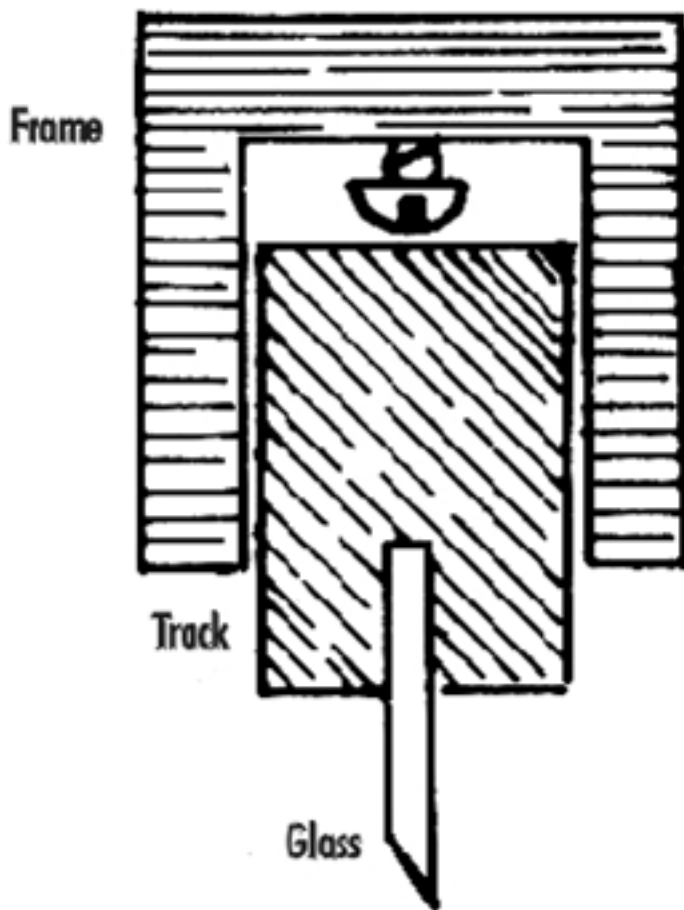


easily defeated by prying the lock or by lifting the door out of its tracks. Fortunately, both of these attacks can be prevented. To prevent forcing the door open, a secondary locking device that fits onto the door track or a "charley-bar" will help. These are available at most

hardware stores.

To prevent the patio door from

being lifted out, it is recommended that pan head screws be installed, evenly spaced, in the upper slide track of the door. The screw heads should protrude just enough to allow free movement of the door

but prevent the door from being lifted out of the track.
